

**MINI KOKODA, Gold Coast**  
**Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2010**

As the Kokoda Challenge gains popularity and we are unable to offer everyone looking to do the event a place, it is therefore our intention to use the Mini Kokoda as an opportunity to allow the teams on the reserve list a chance at getting a team spot.

The Mini Kokoda has 4 current categories. Individual, 2 person, 3 person and 4 person teams. In 2010 there will be a new category called the '**Mini Kokoda Fundraising Challenge**'. All teams that enter this category will have the opportunity to win one of 5 team spots in the 2010 Kokoda Challenge.

Three of the teams spots on offer will be awarded to the teams which raise the highest amounts in fundraising for the Kokoda Challenge Youth Program.

The remaining two team spots will be used as a lottery draw, in which all teams who have raised a minimum \$250 as part of the fundraising challenge will be in with a chance to win a team place in the Kokoda Challenge.

**TERMS & CONDITIONS** of the fundraising challenge category are as follows:

1. All teams must register on the Victory Sports website and pay the entry fee, as per usual teams in the Mini Kokoda Challenge. This is non-refundable fee which covers entry in the event. It is not tax deductible.
2. Once registered, these teams will be forwarded to the KC Administrator who will record and manage the teams entered in this category, with regards to their fundraising endeavours.
3. Teams in this category will be added to the drop down menu on the Donate Online section on the KC website so that they can encourage friends and families to support them.
4. All donations in this category are tax deductible and will contribute directly to the Kokoda Challenge Youth Program.
5. Any cheques are to be made out to the Kokoda Challenge Association Public Fund and any cash donations are to be paid directly into our bank account, details of which will be available on the Mini Kokoda Web page.
6. The KC Administrator will keep a tally of all donations received and a total amount will be available for teams to view on the Kokoda Challenge website on the Mini Kokoda Gold Coast webpage.
7. The 5 teams with the highest fundraising amounts will be posted on the Mini Kokoda tab on the Kokoda Challenge Website on the Monday of each week from the 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2010 till the 7<sup>th</sup> June, 2010.
8. All donations in the fundraising challenge must be banked with the Kokoda Challenge Association by 5pm on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> June. If banking cheques please ensure you allow extra days for the money to clear by this deadline. Any money that clears after this deadline won't count towards the total.
9. At 9am on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> June, the top three teams which have raised the highest amount in fundraising dollars will qualify for the 2010 Kokoda Challenge. These teams will not be announced until Sunday at 20<sup>th</sup> June at the formal presentation at the finish line of the Mini Kokoda Challenge.
10. At 2pm on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> June, at the finish line of the Mini Kokoda Challenge, an independent draw will be conducted. The names of all teams that have raised over \$250 (this does not include entry fee) will be placed in a container (an independent person will audit the draw to ensure all qualified teams are included) and two individual draws will take place to produce the other 2 team spots for the 2010 Kokoda Challenge.
11. The 5 teams who gain entry to the 2010 Kokoda Challenge through the Mini Kokoda Fundraising category are still required to meet the minimum amount of fundraising dollars for entry. Their registration fee (\$330) will be waived as part of winning their entry. However, they will still be required to collect the minimum \$1000 in fundraising dollars. All funds raised in the Mini Kokoda Challenge will be transferred to their teams tally. (ie. if they raise \$600 in Mini Kokoda Challenge they will only have to raise another \$400 to compete in the Kokoda Challenge. If they raise \$2000 in Mini Kokoda - there will be no requirement to raise any more, but it would be more than welcomed and also enable them the chance to win a trip for 4 people to walk the actual Kokoda track in Papua New Guinea).
